Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is allocated by local authorities, or the DFE, to schools and academies with pupils between Reception and Year 11. The grant per eligible pupil for the current financial year is £1320 in primary schools, with £1900 for looked-after and adopted children (Pupil Premium Plus). Schools have the freedom to spend the Premium, which is additional to their underlying budget, in a way they think will best support raising the achievement of disadvantaged pupils in comparison with their non-disadvantaged peers within the school and nationally, whatever their academic starting point and potential. As well as receiving extra funding for Pupil Premium, children also receive a free school meal (FSM).

We will use the Pupil Premium funding received by the school to deliver our overall vision to those pupils who receive it and the wider school community where possible.

Please be aware that since September 2014 all children from the start of Reception to the end of Year 2 receive free school meals (FSM). This means the school will only receive £1320 for children in these year groups if parents apply for the Pupil Premium funding. Please come in and collect a Pupil Premium application form if you think your child might be eligible.

Pupil Premium Spending 2017/18

This document details the spending of the Pupil Premium 2017/18, committed to narrowing the attainment and progress gap.

Our Pupil Premium grant for 2017/18 is £29,040

To minimize barriers to learning and facilitate positive attitudes to learning disadvantaged pupils have had access to Learning Manager time and Social Skills groups.

To increase children's confidence, progress and attainment in reading and writing children have had access to; small group intervention, lead teacher input, breakfast club, FFT, sports clubs and music tuition.

In the 2017/2018 academic year, 75% of KS2 disadvantaged pupils met the combined national standard compared to 48% nationally. In reading, 75% of disadvantaged pupils met the expected standard compared to 60% nationally. In writing 75% of disadvantaged pupils met the national standard compared to 66% nationally and in maths the figure was 75% compared to 63% nationally. The number of disadvantaged pupils achieving greater depth for reading, writing and maths combined was 28% compared with 9% nationally. The number of disadvantaged children in the cohort was 4.

At KS1, the percentage of disadvantaged children meeting the national standard in reading was 100% compared with 63% nationally. 67% of disadvantaged children met the national standard

in writing compared with 54% nationally and in maths the figure was 67% compared with 62% nationally. The number of disadvantaged children in the cohort was 3.

Pupil Premium Spending 2018/19

Our Pupil Premium grant for 2018/19 is £24,199

Key objectives:

1. **Curriculum:** to develop further the range of intervention strategies in use to ensure Pupil Premium students in all years make progress in line with or exceeding the progress of their non-Pupil Premium peers.
2. **Wider Outcomes:** to provide a range of opportunities for students, no matter what their background to access learning opportunities outside the classroom.
